Carlo Ponti. Conductor

Maestro Carlo Ponti is the founder of LAV, prior to which he was the music director and principal conductor of the San Bernardino Symphony, and Associate Conductor of the Russian National Orchestra. He has also worked at the Conductor's Institute in Connecticut under Harold Farberman, with Andrey Boreyko, Mehli Mehta and Zubin Mehta in Los Angeles, and furthered his musical studies in Austria at the Vienna Music Academy under Leopold Hager and Erwin Acel. Maestro Ponti was awarded Italy's Premio Galileo award in 2006 for exceptional musical achievement. In 2011 he was co-recipient of the Lupa di Roma prize in Rome, and received the Premio Civitas 2014 award in Naples, Italy.



The Los Angeles Virtuosi Orchestra

The Los Angeles Virtuosi Orchestra (LAV) is an orchestra of professional musicians dedicated to the advocacy and support of music education, envisioning a world in which every young person has access to music education. Founded in 2013 as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization by Maestro Carlo Ponti, the ensemble was formed on the core belief that an orchestra is a unique educational resource. LAV's mission is to serve as a catalyst in supporting music education through collaborative partnerships with the community, schools, agencies, and other arts organizations, and by allocating 100% of net income from performances to support and develop the study of music.

SOLOISTS

Lisa Delan

American Soprano Lisa Delan has won acclaim as an interpreter of an extensive range of repertoire and is recognized for her versatility and breadth of accomplishment. Ms. Delan has performed on some of the world's leading concert stages including Lincoln Center, Davies Symphony Hall, Madrid's Auditorio Nacional, the Moscow Conservatory, Tchaikovsky Hall, and in a special appearance at Windsor Castle.



Her festival appearances include the Bad Kissingen Festival in Germany, the Colmar Festival in France, the Rachmaninoff Festival in Novgorod, Russia, Festival Napa Valley, the Tuscan Sun Festival, and the Domaine Forget Festival in Quebec. An Audiophile Audition critic wrote "Lisa Delan is still the master" of American song. Among other projects, Ms. Delan is currently developing a genre-defying recording with Christopher O'Riley and Matt Haimovitz featuring art songs written for the soprano by Mark Adamo, John Corigliano, Aaron J. Kernis, Philip Glass, David Sanford, Conrad Tao and Luna Pearl Woolf, based on lyrics by The National, Joni Mitchell, Portishead, Lou Reed, GBV, and Gabriel Kahane.

She has performed throughout the United States, including at the Aspen String Showcase, LACMA Sundays Live and EMMI Recital Series, and recently won the 45th Edith Knox Young Artist Competition, as well as the Elizabeth Mandell and ASTA Competitions.

Catherine Yom Litaker-Eisenberg

Making her debut as a soloist with the Los Angeles Virtuosi Orchestra, Catherine Yom Litaker-Eisenberg is currently an active substitute for the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Lyric Opera of Chicago and San Diego Symphony, and was also Principal Harp of the Civic Orchestra of Chicago during the 2011 – 2012 Season. Equally passionate about

chamber music, Catherine is a founding member of the Chicago Harp Quartet; a dynamic group aiming to expand the repertoire and exposure of the harp. The Quartet has performed for audiences across the US, commissions new works by working with living composers, and has released two critically acclaimed full-length albums.

Alexix Cai

Alexis Cai is currently a Junior at Marlborough School in Los Angeles, and has studied the flute under Jim Walker and Catherine Karoly. This concert marking her debut with the Los Angeles Virtuosi Orchestra, Alexis has been a member of the Claremont Youth Symphony Orchestra, Colburn Youth Orchestra, Ed and Mari Edelman Chamber Music Institute, and has won prizes in the National Flute Association High School Competition, Lansum



International Music Festival and San Diego Flute Guild Competitions, among others. In addition to playing the flute, Alexis is also a skilled pianist, vocalist, and composer.




